Fr. John: It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and

everywhere to give you thanks. Father most holy, through your beloved son, Jesus Christ, your word through whom you made all things, whom you sent as Saviour and redeemer, incarnate by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin. Fulfilling your will and gaining for you a holy people, he stretched out his hands as he endured his Passion, so as to break the bonds of death and manifest the resurrection. Fr. John:

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee. The mother of Jesus was there, and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited. When they ran out of wine, since the wine provided for the wedding was all finished, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' Jesus said, 'Woman why turn to me? My hour has not come vet.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' There were six stone water jars standing there, meant for the ablutions that are customary among the Jews: each could hold twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, 'Fill the jars with water,' and they filled them to the brim. 'Draw some out now,' he told them, 'and take it to the steward.' They did this; the steward tasted the water, and it had turned into wine. Having no idea where it came from – only the servants who had drawn the water knew – the steward called the bridegroom and said, 'People generally serve the best wine first and keep the cheaper

sort until the guests have had plenty to drink, but you have kept the best wine until now.' This was the first of the signs given by Jesus: it was given at Cana in Galilee. He let his glory be seen, and

his disciples believed in him. The Gospel of the Lord.

Fr. John:

Dear children of God, you have come here today to pledge your love before God and before the Church here present in the person of the priest, your families and friends. In becoming husband and wife you give yourselves to each other for life. Put your trust in God as you set out together in life. Make your home a centre of Christian family life. The Christian home makes Christ and his church present in the world of everyday things. May all who enter your home find there the presence of the Lord; for he has said: "Where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them." Now as you are about to exchange your marriage vows, the Church wishes to be assured that you appreciate the meaning of what you do, and so I ask you:

Have you come here of your own free will and choice to marry each

other?
